God's Eye – Ojo de Dios

Ojo de Dios weaving tradition originated from the Huichol indigenous people of Mexico and the Pueblos of New Mexico. This workshop will not only provide you with instructions & helpful hints of the basics of the God's Eye weave but is the perfect project to incorporate scaffolding into your classroom environment. Once the foundation is laid, students will be able to use a variety of weaving techniques, an array of yarn types and objects to enhance their creations. Models will vary in size, layout design and materials used to create the primary structure. As an art educator you will discover how the fine art craft of weaving can be an opportunity for your student artists to incorporate many of the Elements of Art & Principles of Design in their work.
